



DIRECTIONS TO THE LAFAYETTE VETERAN'S HALL

From Oakland / Hwy. 24 east bound:

Take the Acalanes exit. At the bottom of the ramp continue FORWARD onto Mt. Diablo Blvd. Go one mile, the Lafayette Reservoir entrance is on your right, drive a bit more and the Veteran's Hall is on your left at Risa Rd. and Village Center. Continue through the stop light, turn LEFT into the parking lot.
